

## Fine Showing At Sandy Hill Art Gallery

A talented Ottawa area artist, Bernard A. Poulin is giving a one-man show at the Sandy Hill Art Gallery, 280 Nelson Street. It will be on view until Feb. 4.

On graduation from the Normal School of University of Ottawa he was for a time an art teacher in Cornwall. He now is a child care worker and remedial teacher at Mount Saint-Joseph Children's Home, where he lives.

There are 26 items listed in the exhibition. They range from a landscape of Mont-St. Joseph to a series of portraits.

He is excellent at pencil sketches. "Pensive" is one of

the most attractive in this field.

There is a fine ink sketch of Minto Bridge. We also like "Oil Lamp" and "Repose" which depicts a boy resting under a tent with a baseball bat and ball nearby.

Mr. Poulin, born in Windsor, has been a pupil of Roger Saint-Denis.

There are a number of figure studies in the small exhibition. They underline this young artist's really outstanding flair for painting.

Marcel and Margaret Farmer have mounted the exhibition with taste and discernment.—WQK.
