# Television

Fifteen minutes of film that unfortunately may have slipped past viewers last night was CBC's "News Pictorial."

Normally the program is devoted to news items that didn't quite make the news telecast but Thursday it took on a documentary format.

It told the story of Bernie Poulin, a 21-year-old teacher, who is devoting his life to working with emotionally disturbed children.

"Hope is a Good Word," may have lasted only a quarter of an hour but it took a week to film.

Rudi Wolf's camera work was outstanding. It captured

the dedication of the young teacher and the admiration of his pupils.

And the footage was helped greatly by Bob Murphy's skillful editing.

Bernie Poulin — he is also the artist who has painted most of the Red Feather campaign pictures—discussed his work and aspirations.

The over-all result was a bright suppertime show with plenty of food for thought.
