CITIZEN OF THE WEEK



Bernard Poulin receives the CKPM "Citizen of the Week" Award for the week of October 15 - October 21 from CKPM's president and managing director, James A. Stewart, as announced by Mayor Don B. Reid on the program "The Mayor Speaks" at 12.30 p.m. on Sunday.

With so much emphasis these days on the "hippie movement" cries of "be in" and "drop out", sometimes drown out the fact that young people in many communities across Canada have taken on responsibility willingly and are making a significant contribution to society. This week's award winner is one of these. Although a youthful 22 years of age Bernard Poulin has clearly demonstrated that he is concerned with those less fortunate among us, and is doing something about it.

Bernard, originally from Windsor, left high school after Grade 12, and following a year's absence enrolled at the Teachers College at Ottawa University. During this time he worked as a volunteer at Mount St. Joseph's Orphanage here in Ottawa, which he continued doing on week-ends after accepting a position in Cornwall. The sisters at Mount St. Joseph's were experiencing difficulties with some of the children and they invited Mr. Poulin to join their staff full time. Together they sought to solve the problems confronting them, and the end result was their founding of a treatment centre for emotionally disturbed children between the ages of six and twelve. It is believed to be the only such centre for French speaking children in Canada. The centre employs a full professional staff of which Mr. Poulin is director of child care. He has also established a school for the children, departing from the conventional classroom environment, and, attempting to create a more home-like atmosphere, which has achieved positive results. During the centre's two years of existence 47 children have left, better equipped to take their place in society. Bernard is single, although he is contemplating marriage in the near future. He enjoys painting, photography and is a hockey fan. It is indeed with pleasure that we announce Bernard Poulin as, this week's "CKPM Citizen of the Week". As this week's award winner Mr. Poulin automatically becomes a member of the Distinguished Citizens Club, sponsored by the Capital Civilian Club of Ottawa.


